

**Dayton/Miami Valley
Senior Olympics Hall of Fame
2006 Inductees**

Clarence Broaddus – Dayton, Ohio

Age 78

Clarence has been playing tennis for 50 years, taught the game of tennis on grass courts by Dr. James Morton while attending West Industrial College. Played tennis while in the US Army and then went on to play ATA Tour Tennis and USTA tennis mostly in the Midwest. Played against Arthur Ashe at Central State University and was ranked high in the ATA for many years. He won first place in tennis singles in the 1983 Ohio Senior Olympics at the University of Akron. Clarence was a co-founder of the Dayton Tennis Club and played many years of ATA and local tennis.

Leon Burk – Tipp City, Ohio

Age 66

Leon was the 2005 gold medalist in the 5k and 10k cycling time trials at the National Senior Games in Pittsburgh. He was the 2004 and 2005 U.S.C.F (United States Cycling Federation) champion; State champion in 5k and 10k races and the 20k and 40k road races; and has won first place at local level in all distances.

Priscilla Cope

Excelled in badminton and volleyball.

Margaret Fox – Williamsburg, Ohio

Age 77

Margaret won the silver medal in National table tennis singles in Syracuse (1991); Gold medalist in table tennis singles and doubles in Tucson (1997); Silver medal in doubles in Baton Rouge (2001) and Gold medalist in singles and doubles at Hampton Roads (2003). Nationally ranked in women's singles in 5 of the last ten years. Medaled in eight world championships. Numerous Ohio State championships in singles and women's doubles. Also, medaled in three different table tennis events in Nevada several times. Local - Has won both singles and doubles at least eight times. Mixed doubles winner once and runner-up twice. Frequent participant at Hithergreen Senior Center in Centerville.

Francis Goins – Dayton, Ohio

Age 79

Francis competed in tennis all his life. Played 20 years in the Dayton Daily News/Montgomery County Tennis Tournament and the YMCA Tennis Tournament. He medaled in the local Senior Olympics several times. Played in the Ohio Senior Olympics five times and finished third in the 55 age group in 1986. Francis was inducted into the Dayton Tennis Hall of Fame in 1988.

Lloyd Hathcock – Dayton, Ohio

Age 59

Silver medalist in both the 100m and 200m track event at the 1999 National Senior Games in Orlando. Bronze medalist in the 200m event and fourth place in the 100m event at the National Senior Games in Baton Rouge in 2001. First place in the 100m and 200m and third place in the 50m in the Huntsmen World Senior Games in St. George, Utah in 2004. Record holder in the 100m and 200m for the Ohio Senior Olympics. Has participated and won at the local level in Dayton, Cincinnati and Akron.

Joyce Mason – Dayton, Ohio

Age 68

Competed in four National games from 1995-2001 in 3 different sports and 9 different events. At the Nationals, she has one gold, one silver and two bronze medals in bowling. In racquetball she tied for fifth and sixth in javelin. At the state level, she competed in 18 events and won 18 medals: 10 gold, 6 silver and 2 bronze. Joyce has won numerous medals at the local level in Dayton; Fort Wayne, Ind.; and Springfield, Illinois where she still holds their all time high series in bowling in the 60-64 age group.

Burt Saidel – Dayton, Ohio

Age 75

Competed on the national, state and local level and won numerous medals in many track and field events.

Mary Seebeck – New Carlisle, Ohio

Age 79

Competed at the national level since 1989 and has attended all the national events since then. At the 2005 National Senior Games in Pittsburgh, she placed 4th in high jump, 5th in shot put, 7th in javelin and discus. In 2001, she was 6th in javelin and in 1999; she was 6th in high jump. On the state level, she placed first in high jump, discus, javelin and shot put in 2006 and first in race walk in 2004, second in discus and javelin and third in shot put. She competes and consistently wins awards on the local level and assists with the Dayton Area Senior Olympics.

Barb Self – Beavercreek, Ohio

Age 74

Barb has competed in the national, state and local Senior Olympics for several years in track and field (race walk, high jump, javelin, shot put, Discus), tennis and badminton. She received medals consistently at all levels. She served 15 years on the Dayton/Miami Valley Senior Olympics Board and 10 years on the Ohio Senior Olympics Board. Assisted in organizing the local games for more than 15 years.

Jan Stansel – Kettering, Ohio

Age 71

Jan received a gold medal in table tennis women's doubles at the National Senior Games in Tucson (1997) and Hampton Roads (2003). Received a silver medal in table tennis women's doubles at the 2001 National Senior Games in Baton Rouge. In 2006, she is ranked in the national women's singles top twelve. On the state level she has been a gold medalist five times in table tennis women's doubles and once a silver medalist. She has two gold medals, two silver medals and a bronze medal in table tennis women's singles. She has competed the last twelve years and been a winner in singles and doubles events in table tennis events on the local level and has won the mixed doubles the last three years.

Norm Woolley – Dayton, Ohio

Age 88

Norm participates in the 200m, 400m and 800m running events. He has earned numerous medals in track and field at the national, state and local levels. Attended the National Senior Games in Orlando and currently serves on the Dayton/Miami Valley Senior Olympics Board.
